The event is a score: get as many controls as possible in a set time. Each team consists of three members. Member 1 does 60 minutes. Each control is worth 10 points. Member 2 does 45 minutes with each control worth 12 points and the 3rd member does 30 minutes with each control worth 15 points. 10 points extra is awarded for Fancy dress.
